# Verge Rubbish Collection – 16 July 2019



## Shire of Cunderdin Verge Rubbish Collection

is on **Tuesday 16th July 2019**

If you have waste or rubbish that you would like to dispose of,  
please neatly stack it on the verge for collection.

### What we will collect:

Up to two cubic metres of waste (equivalent to two 6'x4' trailer loads).

WASTE MUST BE SEPERATED INTO PILES

Refrigeration & White Goods = Fridges & Freezers (doors to be removed)

Scrap Metal = Wire remnants must be safely & securely bundled. Maximum length 1.8 metres.

Mattresses

Household Furniture & General Junk –couches, tables, televisions, vacuum cleaners, carpet etc.  
Maximum length 1.8 metres.

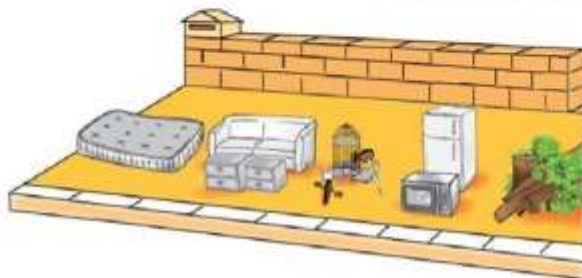
Green waste = Branches, cuttings & leaves. Maximum length 1.5 metres (5 feet). Maximum diameter 150mm 6 inches). Place leaves and small vegetation in cardboard boxes (NOT plastic bags). Stack branch ends towards street.

### What we won't collect:

NO MORE than two trailer loads of waste or green waste; NO Bricks, Building Rubble, Concrete or Cement; NO Foodstuffs or Household Waste. (Use general bin); NO Gas bottles or Cylinders.

NO Small items that need to be boxed or bagged for collection = eg. Clothing, Books, 'knick-knacks'

NO Waste that is NOT correctly separated; NO Sand, Soil or Lawn Sods; NO Glass or Mirrors; NO Car Bodies/Parts, Tyres, Batteries; NO Hazardous Waste or Liquids; NO Dead Animals; NO Asbestos or other Fibrous Cement.

## Enrolling to vote

For the Local Government Election on 19 October 2019

You live in the district (or ward) and are on the State electoral roll.	No need to apply.

You are not an Australian Citizen but were on the local government electoral roll in 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in	Yes—See how to apply below.
Your property is rateable and is owned or occupied by more than two people or by a company.	Two people only who are not already on the local government roll for the district (or ward) must be selected by a majority of the owners or occupiers or the company. They must be on the State or Commonwealth roll to be eligible. If more than one property is involved the same two people must be
You own property that is rateable in the district (or ward) and you are on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll but you live	Yes—See how to apply below.
You have a right of occupancy of property in the district (or ward) that is rateable and you are on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll but live elsewhere	If you have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date you apply you should make an application—See how

You can get an “Enrolment Eligibility Claim” form from any local government office. To be able to vote for this election your application must reach the person named below by 5:00pm on the 30th August 2019. Those nominated by a company must attach the letter of nomination to the form.

## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

### **Standpipes within Shire of Cunderdin closed to public from July 2019**

#### **REGIONAL FIXED STANDPIPES – NEW CLASSIFICATIONS**

Water is a valuable resource and regulated charges are set by the State Government based on its use.

From the 1 July 2019 the Water Corporation will implement a new charging system for Local Government owned fixed standpipes. The new charges will be prohibitive for the Shire to continue to supply potable water to residents through this system.

The new pricing structure is linked to the size of the standpipe meter, as this determines the flow rate. Sale of water from a standpipe with an outlet diameter of greater than 25mm (high flow) will incur a service charge of up to many thousands of dollars and a base rate of more than \$8/KL, which is not feasible for the Shire to charge out to its ratepayers.

As a result of these changes the Council has resolved that standpipes within the Shire of Cunderdin to be closed to the public. Accordingly, they will be locked and only accessible for Council usage and for firefighting purposes.

Unfortunately, this also means locals and businesses will only be allowed to purchase water from Commercial standpipes within the townsites of Cunderdin and Meckering.

Keys for these standpipes must be obtained from the Shire Office or Barkley Royal Meckering.

In the event of a State Government declared “drought zone” exists, all shire-owned fixed standpipes will be made available at concessional rates to the community for drought relief in accordance with the terms of the declaration conditions. The Standpipes will be progressively secured over the coming 6 weeks prior to **1 July 2019** requirements of the Water Corporation.
