Background

Provisions within the *Local Government Act 1995*, S2.29, and the Local Government (Constitution) Regulations 1998, C13, state that a person elected as a Councillor has to make a declaration in the prescribed form before acting in the office and the format in which that declaration is to be made.

Four positions on Council were open for nomination in the Shire of Cunderdin 2025 Ordinary Elections. All four (4) positions are for a four (4) year term in office from 2025 – 2029.

All four (4) positions were filled by nominating candidates and they are to be duly elected unopposed.

Provisions within the *Local Government Act 1995*, Schedule 2.3, Division 1, provide for the election of the Shire President by the Council.

Section 2.29 of the *Act* states that a person elected by the Council as President is required to make a declaration in the prescribed form before acting in the office.

Local Government (Constitution) Regulations 1998, C13, provides for the format in which the person elected as the President must make the declaration.
